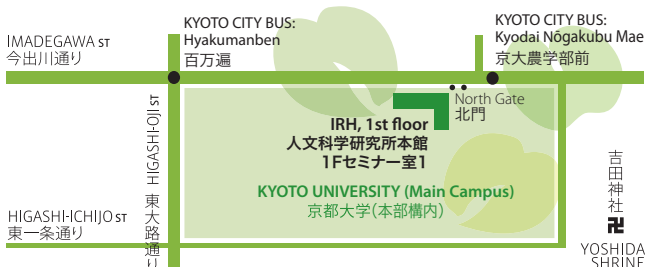
**Hasegawa
Shigure**

On War Cooperation
in *Kagayaku*

SPEAKER

Cooperation in the “Fifteen Years War” by Japanese writers is already a well researched field. In this connection, it is worth considering the case of Hasegawa Shigure (1879-1941), the first woman Kabuki playwright. Hasegawa, an active participant in many literary magazines, also established and edited the literary journal *Nyonin Geijutsu* (1928-1932) as well as its offshoot *Kagayaku*, a four-page leaflet intended to provide space for women writers. This talk will attempt to show how *Kagayaku*—started with the intention of publishing progressive writings by women—in spite of Hasegawa’s original commitment to peace ended up embracing the idea of the Greater East Asian Co-Prosperty Sphere that eventually led to war.

Sreedevi Reddy, author of *Zasshi Nyonin Geijutsu ni okeru jendaa gensetsu-media* (2010, Gakujutsu shuppankai), is a Hakuho Foundation Research Fellow and a Visiting Fellow at the Institute for Research in Humanities of Kyoto University. Earlier she had taught Japanese Cultural and Media Studies, and Communication subjects at Shizuoka University as an Associate Professor. She has varied interests in modern Japanese literature, media and gender studies, and has published several articles in Japanese on literary/media narratives. At present she is engaged in a book project on the life history of Hasegawa Shigure.
